

Callout boxes:

- The children will think about what they would like to achieve by the end of the year.

We hope that you find the mid-year report useful. The reports will be sent home on Friday 1st March which is the week before Parents Evening. We hope that the report will give you information prior to the meeting that supports a pertinent and useful dialogue between you and your child's teacher in relation to your child's achievements and next steps. Due to GDPR regulations, you will need to collect the report from your child's class teacher at the end of the day on Friday 1st. If this is not possible, the report will be available for you to collect from the school office.

In the summer term we will send out end of year reports as usual. These will have information in them relating to your child's achievements over the year including their progress and attainment in relation to Age Related Expectations (ARE).
