DONATIONS VIA SCOPAY Extended Day

Children in Key Stage 1 (Reception, Year 1 and Year 2) are entitled to Universal Infant Free School Meals. However, as Mr Mills explained during the initial parents' meeting, there is currently a funding shortfall of approximately 37p per meal, which schools are required to meet from their own budgets.

For families who would like to support the school with this additional cost, voluntary donations can be made via SCOPAY. A contribution of £1.85 per week, (£25 per term, per child) would greatly help us offset this funding gap and support the continued provision of high-quality resources and opportunities for all children. SAFEGUARDING CONCERN

I want to share a concern that has been brought to my attention regarding a series called *The Amazing Digital Circus*, which is currently available on streaming platforms including Netflix. At first glance, the programme may appear to be aimed at young children due to its colourful animation, cartoon-style characters and playful title. However, the content is intended for an older audience and includes themes

and scenes that many parents may find unsuitable for primary-aged children. The show carries a 12 rating on Netflix and includes content warnings for violence, language and drug misuse. Some episodes contain scenes that could be upsetting for younger viewers, including depictions of injury, threatening situations and other disturbing imagery presented in an animated format.
