We will be developing our core strength, balance and co-ordination skills.


We will practise our gross motor (BIG) and fine motor (SMALL) movements

Communication:



- If you need to pass on a message to a Bumblebee member of staff, please write a note and give it to the member of staff who is on the Bumblebee gate in the morning.
- Alternatively, you can speak to Miss Fisher-Smith at the end of the day, once all of the children have been dismissed. Or you may email the school office and they will pass the message onto the Bumblebee staff team.
- During the first half term, your child will be given a school record book. This is for you to record when you hear your child read. We collect these record books in weekly to see how much the children have been reading at home. We expect the children to read 5 times a week at home.
- Every Friday I send a weekly Bumblebees Newsletter via Arbor for you to read. It will outline the learning we have completed and any upcoming key dates you need to be aware of.

Communication continued:

- Please try to avoid chatting to the teacher first thing in the morning. It is important that they are 'present' for the children at this vital time of the day.
- If you would like to meet with your child's teacher please call the or email the office to make an appointment. adminoffice@ropleyschool.hants.sch.
- Our office team may ask you what the appointment is regarding. This is so we can prepare for the meeting and make good use of time in the meeting.
- Parent evenings are held in the Autumn and Spring term.
- Communication route: Initially please arrange to meet with your child's teacher. If your concerns are ongoing and haven't been resolved then then you may wish to meet with a senior leader and then the head teacher.



Morning and after school routines

- School starts at 8:45am and children are expected to be in school ready to learn by this time.
- The side gate opens at **8:35am** and children can arrive and enter the building from this time onwards.
- The gate closes at **8:45am**. If you arrive after this time you will need to go into school via the school office and will be asked why you are late.
- It is important for your child that they arrive on time. Lessons start promptly and arriving late can mean embarrassment as well as lost learning.
- Parents are asked not to enter the school building. This helps the children to become independent and start the day smoothly.
- School finishes at 3:15pm.
- Children attending 'The Hive' after school club will go to the round classroom outside to be met and registered.

What your child will and will not need.

- School uniform with school shoes (no boots please).
- PE kit with trainers for outdoor PE. Tracksuits maybe worn in the colder months. We have optional house coloured hoodies as well.
- A FULL water bottle. It is best if it has a sports cap so that spillages are limited. Your child must only have WATER in their bottle, no squash or juice please.
- All stationery will be provided by school so pencil cases are not necessary.
- Infants are provided with one piece of free fruit a day.
- Due to several children with allergies it is essential that packed lunches and snacks MUST NOT contain nuts.
- Toys and games from home are not to be brought into school.
- All items must be clearly named, preferably with your child's full name, not just their surname.




What happens when?


Parent helpers

- We warmly welcome parent helpers into school. Bumblebee Class do not have parent helpers until after the first half term break, to allow the children to settle into school.
- All of the classes will let the office team know what days and times they would like volunteers to come into school.
- This is likely to be for half hour or hour long slots either at the beginning or the end of the day.
- If you are able to volunteer please let the school office know and we will match you up with a class and time slot.
- We request that volunteers do not to volunteer in their own child's class for reading as it can be a distraction for your child.
- All volunteers will be requested to complete a DBS check and attend a briefing regarding their role. This will include a safeguarding element.



Uniform

- V Neck Jumper or sweatshirt in Royal Blue, with or without logo.
- Sky blue polo shirt with or without logo
- Charcoal Grey skirt, pinafore, shorts or trousers
- Summer dress in the summer
- Black, white or grey socks or grey tights
- Black Shoes (not boots or trainers)
- Long hair must be neatly tied back with a small tie.
